Notes for Contributors

The following notes have been compiled for the guidance of authors who are preparing papers for submission to Chinese Geographical Science.

Submission of papers

Papers may be sent for editorial consideration to the Editorial Department.

Only the editors has the responsibility for deciding whether a paper is to be accepted, rejected or referred back to the author for amendment. He will be guided by the advice of the Editorial Department and by other competent referees selected for their knowledge of both the subject matter and the region under discussion in the paper. The paper must fall within the stated aims and scope of the journal.

Before preparing a manuscript for submission authors are asked to study carefully the following Notes. Papers which do not conform to the conventions of the journal may be returned to the authors for amendment, with consequent publication delay.

Form of Submission

Typescript. The typescript should be double spaced throughout and typed on one side of the page only.

Language. English is the preferred language of publication.

Length. The normal maximum length for a contribution is 8,000 words. However, all papers should be written as concisely as possible. Papers which, in the opinion of the Editor, can be shortened without sacrifice of clarity or of scientific content will be referred back to the author for modification. Exceptionally long papers extending to 10,000 words will be considered if they are of great academic importance to an international readership. Title / abstract / key words. The title should indicate clearly the nature of the subject. Papers must contain an abstract and three to five key words briefly summarizing the essential contents; the abstract should not normally exceed 250 words.

Affiliation of author(s). The author(s) and the full address of their institution(s) and postal code must be given under the title.

References. References in the text should be cited as [1], [2], [3]. A full reference list should be typed double—spaced and given Aranic numerals numbered consecutively in the order in which they are referred to in the text at the end of the paper, in the form given bolow:

Artwork / maps. All photographs, diagrams, maps and charts should be referred to as figures and given Arabic numerals numbered consecutively in the order in which they are referred to in the text. Figures legends may be typed on a separate sheet.

Measurements. All measurements must be given in the metric system.

AIMS AND SCOPE

CHINESE GEOGRAPHICAL SCIENCE publishes research articles relating to physical geography and its branch disciplines (landscape ecology, environmental geography, climatology, hydrogeography, geomorphology, pedogeography, biogeography, etc.), human geography and its branch disciplines (economic geography, population geography, urban geography, social geography, cultural geography, historical geography, etc.), cartography, remote sensing and geographical information system.
